Beth and I attended the Logan County Republican Central Committee's sponsored "Meet and Greet" event held last Thursday, February 13, 2025, at Flossie's and Delzena's Restaurant. Beth was disappointed by the lack of voters attending. I think a public debate – conducted with civility, may have generated greater interest among the voters.

In the upcoming Republican Primary, the voters have a choice of three candidates. Two of the candidates have track records of two entirely different governing systems.
